### REPLACEMENT ROPE FERRULE

NOTE: Late 1972 production will have replacement ferrule as standard

Eliminates clogging of cooling fins and blower housing, resulting in overheating of engines.

Engine pulls in cleaner air away from operation.

Can be used on long life models 494, 498, and earlier models (1200, 1100, 900, 700) using Clinton

Stamped Construction Recoil Starter.

#### Procedure For Attaching "Snorkel" Housing:

- Pull over recoil starter until approx.
  24" of rope is free.
- 2. Until knot retaining handle & remove handle.
- 3. Thread rope through ferrule provided on "Snorkel" housing.
- 4. Replace starter handle.
- Push "Snorkel" housing over blower housing until it bottoms on recoil starter.
- 6. Mark inner housing and drill 2 side holes (Size . 190-. 195, or #10 drill), also hole in center of housing (Size . 250 or 1/4 in. drill).
- 7. Install the two Hex head slotted tapping screws in side holes and one Hex head washer tapping screw in center hole.
